## Quick Hits

- The season-opening win over Louisiana Tech was Texas A&M's 12th consecutive season-opening win and 13th straight win in a home opener ... since 1945, A&M is 57-11 (.838) in home openers.
- Four Aggies made their A&M debut on Friday night (Alex Caruso, Fabyon Harris, J'Mychal Reese, Andrew Young).
- Senior Elston Turner led the Aggies in scoring with 15 points against the Bulldogs on Friday, including 13 in the second half ... It marked the 16th time he has led Texas A&M in scoring during the last two seasons.
- The Aggies return two starters (Elston Turner, Keith Davis) and nine total letterwinners (Daniel Alexander, Keith Davis, Jordan Green, Jarod Jahns, Grant Jolly, Blake McDonald, Elston Turner and Ray Turner) ... overall, A&M returns 50.7 percent of its scoring output from the 2011-12 campaign, highlighted by leading scorer Elston Turner, who averaged 13.8 points per game a year ago.
- The Texas A&M-Troy contest is part of the 2012 Edward Jones CBE Hall of Fame Classic ... the event will also saw the Aggies defeat LA Tech 71-59 on Friday night and next week the tournament's scene will shift to Kansas City's Sprint Center ... in KC, A&M will face Saint Louis on Nov. 19 in the CBE semifinals before facing Kansas or Washington State the next day.
- The Aggies are 101-10 (.910) all-time in non-conference games inside Reed Arena, which hosted its first basketball game in the fall of 1998.
- Texas A&M & Louisiana Tech have never met before on the hardwood, but the Aggies are 12-8 all-time against current members of the Sun Belt Conference.
- Head coach Billy Kennedy returns for his second season in Aggieland ... in his 15th overall season as a head coach, Kennedy owns a 226-197 (.533) career record ... The two-time Ohio Valley Coach of the Year has enjoyed success at previous head coaching positions at Murray State, Southeastern Louisiana and Centenary before taking his current position at A&M.
- Kennedy has faced Troy five times as head coach, holding a 2-1 record against the Trojans while at Centenary and splitting a pair of meetings vs Troy while coaching at Southeastern Louisiana.

## 2012 Edward Jones CBE Hall of Fame Classic

The Texas A&M men's basketball team has been selected to serve as an opening-round host for the 2012 CBE Hall of Fame Classic as announced by the National Association of Basketball Coaches.

Texas A&M, which will play four games during the course of the event, joins other host schools Kansas, Saint Louis and Washington State as the sites for the tournament's opening-round games, beginning on Nov. 9. Each team will play two games on campus before advancing to the championship rounds on Nov. 19-20 at Sprint Center in Kansas City, Mo.

Joining the four host schools in the 2012 CBE Hall of Fame Classic are Eastern Washington, Louisiana Tech, Santa Clara, Southeast Missouri State, Tennessee-Chattanooga, Troy, USC-Upstate and Utah Valley. Santa Clara and Tennessee-Chattanooga will serve as sub-hosts for games played November 18-23.

The Aggies will face Louisiana Tech to begin the event and kick off the 2012-13 season on their home court at Reed Arena on Nov. 9 before returning action Nov. 12 when A&M will play host to Troy.

ESPN Networks will broadcast the four championship round games. The semifinal doubleheader featuring Texas A&M and Saint Louis will be aired on ESPN2 at 6:30 p.m. (CT), followed by Washington State and Kansas on ESPN2. The next evening, the consolation game will be shown on ESPN3 at 6:00 p.m. (CT), followed by the championship game on ESPN2.

## Scouting Troy

- Troy opened the season on Friday with a 56-53 home victory over Mississippi State.
- The Trojans are coming off a 10-18 season that saw them finish fifth in the Sun Belt East Division with a 5-11 league mark.
- The Bulldogs return four letterwinners and three starters - senior guard Justin Wright, who averaged 10.3 points per game a year ago, senior guard Emil Jones and junior guard R.J. Jones.
- Head coach Don Maestri is in his 31st season guiding the Trojan men's basketball program ...He's 489-383 all-time as a collegiate head coach.

## No Relation for the Turners

Despite being brothers-in-arms on the court, Texas A&M seniors Elston Turner and Ray Turner are of no relation. Elston hails from Sacramento, Calif., but went to Elkins High School in Missouri City, Texas, while Ray grew up in Houston, Texas, and is a product of Jones High School.



## Series History: Troy

### First Meeting

- Monday will be the first meeting between Texas A&M and Troy in men's basketball.
- A&M head coach Billy Kennedy is 3-2 all-time against Troy. While coaching at Centenary Kennedy was 2-1 against the Trojans and split a pair of meetings against Troy while at Southeastern Louisiana.
- The Aggies are 12-8 all-time against current members of the Sun Belt Conference. A&M's most common opponent among the league's schools is North Texas, who the Aggies are 12-8 against all-time.

## Long-Term Success

- Texas A&M is one of only 20 teams in the entire country which have advanced to the NCAA Tournament in (at least) 6 of the last 7 years ... joining the Aggies are BYU, Duke, Georgetown, Gonzaga, Kansas, Kentucky, Louisville, Marquette, Memphis, Michigan State, North Carolina, Ohio State, Pitt, Purdue, Texas, Villanova, West Virginia, Wisconsin and Xavier.
- A&M has won nearly 70 percent of its games over the last 8 years (180-81, .690).
- The Aggies have won 53 Big 12 games since the start of the 2007 league season ... prior to that, A&M had totaled only 43 victories in the first 10 years of Big 12 play (53-43 since 2006, 43-116 from 1997-2006).

## Head Coach Billy Kennedy

- Billy Kennedy was named the 21st coach in Texas A&M men's basketball history on May 16, 2011 ... he is a native of New Orleans and has spent 14 seasons as a head coach, with a record of 226-197 ... over the last three seasons, his teams have combined to post a record of 69-32.
- Over his last eight years as a head coach, Kennedy's teams have averaged 20 wins a season, earned four conference titles and made three trips to the postseason—two to the NCAA Tournament and one in the NIT ... in addition, the Murray State squad which he built before heading to College Station finished the 2012 season 31-2, won the Ohio Valley title at 15-1 and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament.
- Kennedy's veteran staff in Aggieland has a combined 94 years of collegiate coaching experience and over the last 11 years has been a part of 18 conference titles and 22 postseasons (15 NCAA, 7 NIT).

## Championship-Caliber Staff

- Billy Kennedy has put together a veteran staff in his first season in Aggieland ... the group has a combined 94 years of collegiate coaching experience.
- Over the last decade, the group has been a part of 18 conference titles and 22 postseasons (15 NCAA, 7 NIT) ... in 2010-11, each staff member won a championship at his respective school and as a group averaged 25 wins on the year

## Aggie Trends (Based on 2011-12 Season)

- Texas A&M was undefeated (13-0) when leading with five minutes to play.
- A&M was 12-3 when holding the lead at the half.
- A&M was 12-3 when holding foes under 40 percent shooting.
- The Aggies were undefeated (12-0) when holding opponents under 60 points.
- A&M was 7-4 when grabbing 12 or more offensive rebounds.
- A&M went 9-2 when shooting more free throws than their opponent.
- A&M was 11-3 when out-rebounding its opponent.

## Reed Arena Success

- A&M is 58-12 at Reed Arena since the start of the 2008-09 season with a 22-11 mark in conference games.
- The Aggies are 92-17 (.844) at home since the start of the 2006-07 season and are 125-22 (.850) since the start of the 2004-05 campaign.
- A&M has won 40 of its last 45 home games against unranked opponents (15 of last 19 in conference play).
- A&M is 166-63 (.725) in 14 seasons at Reed Arena ... the Aggies were 41-41 the first six years at Reed and are 125-22 since.
- Texas A&M went 8-1 in non-conference games at Reed Arena in 2011 ... the Aggies are 101-10 (.910) all-time in non-conference games inside the facility, which hosted its first basketball game in the fall of 1998 ... a loss to Rice on Dec. 22 snapped A&M's 67-game non-conference home win streak at Reed Arena (which dated back to the start of the 2005-06 season) and 80-game regular-season, non-conference home win streak (which dated back to 2003), both school records.

## Elston Honored as one the Country's Top Shooters

Senior guard Elston Turner was named one of the top shooters in the country in early November by CBSSports.com college basketball insider Jeff Goodman.

Turner, who ranked 19th on the list, made his A&M debut last season after transferring from the University of Washington

During his first season on the court for the Aggies, Turner was named Honorable Mention All-Big 12. The Sacramento, Calif., native led the team in scoring with an average of 13.8 points per game and finished the regular season in the Big 12's top 10 in four categories: points (13.8 per game), minutes played (33.8 per game), three-point shots (7) and three-point percentage (38.9).

The list ranked Turner above Erik Murphy, a junior forward from Florida who checked in at No. 31, making the Aggie sharpshooter the highest rated SEC player on the list.



## Player Notables

### Jarod Jahns

- Hard-working senior returns for his third season on the court for the Aggies
- Earned a spot on the roster after a walk-on tryout in the Fall of 2010
- Has appeared in 12 career games entering the 2012-13 campaign.

### Elston Turner

- Led the Aggies in scoring with 15 points, including 13 in the second half in the season-opening win over LA Tech ... It marked the 16th time he has led Texas A&M in scoring during the last two seasons.
- Led the Aggies in scoring with a 13.8 point per game average in 2011-12, scoring 442 total points ... in addition to scoring, led the team in minutes (33.8/game), 3-point field goals (7), 3-point percentage (38.9) and free-throw percentage (79.1) ... his 70 treys ranked seventh on the school's all-time single-season charts ... became only the fifth player in school history to hit at least 70 treys in a season.

- Tallied a team-best four double-doubles in 2011-12... pulled down a career-best 15 rebounds against Arkansas Tech (12/29/11) while setting his personal best in with 20 points twice, vs Liberty (11/9/11) and vs Souther (11/13/11).
- Honored for his work in the classroom, being named second-team academic All-Big 12.

### Keith Davis

- Played in all 32 games last season, making 13 starts at the "5" position ... averaged 17 minutes, 1.4 points and 3.6 rebounds ... led the team in blocks with 19.
- Career-high in points is nine, coming on Nov. 12, 2010 against Alcorn State ... pulled down a personal-best nine rebounds twice, vs Oklahoma (1/21/12) and ULM (12/10/11).
- Blocked a career-high five shots in win over Sam Houston State (12/7/11), the most in a game by an Aggie since 2009.

### Blake McDonald

- Reserve guard who has played in 15 games during his two seasons in Aggieland.
- The lone basket of his career came on Nov. 12, 2010, against Alcorn State.
- Received Texas A&M Outstanding Athletics Scholar Award in 2011.

### Daniel Alexander

- During his first season at A&M in 2011-12 appeared in 28 games, starting four ... while in the starting rotation, averaged 30.8 minutes.
- Averaged 11 minutes, 2.4 points and 2.3 rebounds last season ... connected at 38 percent clip from behind the arc (12-of-32).
- Scored a career-best 12 points against Baylor on Feb. 1, 2012, making 4-of-7 shots from three point range ... set a personal best with eight rebounds against Arkansas Tech on Dec. 29, 2011.

### Jordan Green

- Appeared in 31 games as a true freshman, starting 13 ... averaged 16.3 minutes, 3.4 points and 1.7 rebounds ... ranked third on the team with 22 steals.
- Scored a career-high 14 point on 6-of-8 shooting against No. 3 Missouri on Feb. 18, 2012 ... played a career-high 32 minutes in win at Texas Tech (2/14/12).

- Scored 14 points in the season-opening win over LA Tech.
- Led all scorers with 28 points by making 11-of-15 shots, including 4-of-5 from 3-point range, during the Aggies' exhibition win over Incarnate Word on Nov. 3.
- Newcomer comes to Texas A&M after playing two seasons at the College of Southern Idaho, where he helped lead CSI to the 2011 NJCAA National Championship.

### Shawn Smith

- Talented scoring guard who was rated as a three-star recruit by ESPN, Rivals.com, Scout.com.
- Ruled ineligible for the 2012-13 campaign but will redshirt and return to the Aggie line-up next season with four years of eligibility remaining.

## Aggies Find a Home in the SEC

The 2012-13 campaign is a historic one for the Aggie basketball program as it will compete in its inaugural season in the Southeastern Conference after spending the previous 16 years in the Big 12 Conference.

In what was described as a "100-year decision" for Texas A&M University, administrators process for making this monumental decision began in late spring 2010 after the departure of the University of Nebraska and the University of Colorado from the Big 12 Conference. When issues arose in 2011 that further undermined the stability of the Big 12, Texas A&M President R. Bowen Loftin resumed internal discussions about conference alignment, leading to a phone call to SEC Commissioner Mike Slive on July 21.

On Aug. 25, Texas A&M officially notified the Big 12 Conference that it was exploring options related to the institution's athletic conference affiliation. Less than a week later on Aug. 31, Texas A&M notified the Big 12 that it would submit an application to join another athletic conference. Texas A&M's application letter was received by the SEC on Sept. 5, and on Sept. 25, the SEC presidents and chancellors voted unanimously to unconditionally accept the Aggies as the 13th member of the storied conference.

For the Aggie basketball team, the new league will hold many firsts as well as the chance to rekindle some long-standing rivalries. Texas A&M will be reunited with old Southwest Conference running-mate Arkansas, who has faced the Aggies 147 times throughout the years, and neighboring Louisiana's LSU, who A&M has played 24 times previously.

Additionally, this season will see the Aggies face the SEC's Georgia and South Carolina for the first time ever.

## Smith and Space Set to Return in 2013-14

Sophomore forward Antwan Space and freshman Shawn Smith will each sit out the 2012-13 campaign before returning to the Aggie line-up ready to go for next season.

Space transferred to Texas A&M after playing one season at Florida State. The 6-foot-8 forward continues a long trend of athletes to come to Aggieland from DeSoto, Texas, which is also the hometown of teammate Keith Davis. Space will have three years of eligibility remaining.

Smith, a highly-recruited scoring guard, will redshirt this season before returning with four years of eligibility next year. The 6-foot-4 guard hails from Jacksonville, Fla., where he attended Faith Baptist Christian School.

## Up Next

Texas A&M will host Prairie View A&M on Thursday, Nov. 15, at Reed Arena ... tip-off is set for 7 p.m. and the game will be televised by FSN ... the Aggies lead the all-time series with the Panthers by the count of 10-0.

## Last Time Out: A&M 71, Louisiana Tech 59

Elston Turner scored 15 points and Fabyon Harris added 14 in his Texas A&M debut as the Aggies cruised to a 71-59 win over Louisiana Tech in the season opener for both teams.

Texas A&M was up by five before using a 9-3 spurt to stretch its lead to 39-28 with about 15 1/2 minutes left. A 3-pointer by Turner sparked that run, and the Bulldogs missed eight shots in that span.

Harris joined the Aggies after two seasons at the College of Southern Idaho. He averaged 17.1 points and 5.1 rebounds last season.

Freshman J'Mychal Reese, who was rated the No. 1 high school point guard in Texas as last season, started in his A&M debut and had six points, three rebounds and two assists.

Texas A&M's Kourtney Roberson looked good in his first game since breaking his left ankle after playing just nine games last season, and had 12 points and six rebounds. He helped the Aggies dominate inside, and they outscored Louisiana Tech 32-14 in the paint.

- Conducts research valued at more than \$630 million annually, placing it among the top 20 universities nationally and third behind only MIT and the University of California at Berkeley for universities without medical schools.
- Has an endowment valued at more than \$5 billion, which ranks fourth among U.S. public universities and 10th overall.
- Named second in the nation by The Wall Street Journal among all universities, public and private, in a survey of top U.S. corporations, non-profits and government agencies, based on graduates that recruiters prefer to hire.
- Corps of Cadets is recognized among the nation's largest uniformed student bodies at more than 2,000 strong. Texas A&M commissions more officers than any other institution outside of the nation's service academies.

## This is Aggie Athletics

- Claimed three NCAA championships (women's basketball, women's outdoor T&F, men's outdoor T&F) and nine conference titles in 2010-11, both school-bests.
- Finished eighth nationally in the prestigious Learfield Sports Director's Cup all-sport rankings in 2010-11, tallying its most points ever and leading all Big 12 schools. In the inaugural Capital One Cup, which rates teams' final national rankings, the Aggie women finished second nationally with five top-10 finishes, while the Aggie men finished tied for third with five top-10 finishes.
- Claimed 32 Big 12 team titles during their final five years in the conference before moving to the SEC.

## Aggie Traditions

- Recognized as Home of the **12th Man**, where students stand during football games to show support for the team—and for fellow Aggies—a personification of the Aggie Spirit.
- **Reveille**, the first lady of Aggieland, is a purebred collie and the official mascot of Texas A&M. As a five-star general, she is the highest ranking member of the Corps of Cadets. The most current Reveille is Reveille VIII, and she was officially introduced on August 30, 2008.
- **Yell Leaders** are a team of upperclassmen, three seniors and two juniors, elected each year by the student body. Aggie Yell Leaders still wear white during games and attend all home and away football games and many home events of other sports.
- The distinctive **Aggie Ring** serves as the symbolic link to the Aggie network of former students. The ring is not given, it must be earned academically. It was E.C. Jonas, class of 1894, who designed the ring Aggies wear today. Nothing on the ring has changed, except when the university's name changed to Texas A&M University in 1963.
- At a yell practice before the 1930 TCU game, a dedicated fan and member of the Texas A&M Board of Regents named Pinky Downs '06 shouted, "What are we going to do to those Horned Frogs?" Improvising, he borrowed the name of a sharp-pronged frog hunting tool, called a gig. **"Gig 'em, Aggies!"** he said as he made a fist with his thumb extended straight up. With that, the first hand sign in the old Southwest Conference was born.
- In true Aggie Spirit, **'Howdy'** is the official greeting of Texas A&M. The university is known for its welcoming attitude and for making sure no one who visits the campus feels like a stranger.

## Aggie Basketball 101

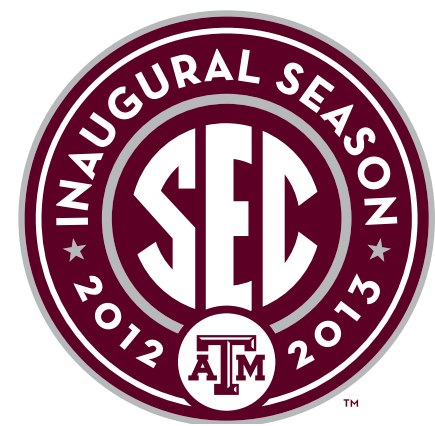
- The Aggies are in the midst of the 101st season of basketball at Texas A&M University ... the first team was fielded for the 1912-13 campaign.
- The inaugural team was coached by F.D. Steger and won its first ever game (date unknown) over Marlin (Texas) High School, 78-8 ... the first "collegiate" opponent for the program was later that season with a pair of games against Sam Houston Normal Institute (now Sam Houston State University).

## This Week in History

- FEB. 9, 1994: A&M gets the program's 1,000th win, 79-66, over Oral Roberts.
- FEB. 10, 1968: In the highest scoring regulation game in school history, A&M outlasts Texas, 117-105.
- FEB. 12, 2005: A&M draws 13,000-plus fans for the first time in program history, jamming a crowd of 13,016 into Reed Arena for a game against No. 12 Oklahoma State.

## The Homes of Aggie Hoops

- **DeWARE FIELD HOUSE (1924-1954)**: Originally named Memorial Gymnasium, DeWare Field House sat on the northwest corner of Kyle Field and loomed over the football stadium until the construction of the second decks in the 1950s ... once basketball moved to G. Rollie White, the facility was still used for recreational sports before it was demolished in 1997 to make room for the Kyle Field north end zone expansion ... it was built for a cost of \$140,000.
- **G. ROLLIE WHITE COLISEUM (1954-1998)**: Known as "The Holler House on the Brazos", Aggie basketball called this building home for 44 years ... it had a seating capacity of 7,800 ... it is located on the northeast corner of Kyle Field (football) and, while still standing, is no longer used for sporting events—the arena floor is the temporary home of the campus bookstore while renovations to the student union (known as the Memorial Student Center) are going on across the street ... it was built for a cost of \$670,000 and was air-conditioned in 1967.
- **REED ARENA (1998)**: 12,989-seat Reed Arena was built for \$33.4 million, opened in the spring of 1998 and became the new home of Aggie basketball that fall ... the building has seen several recent renovations, including the addition of a large four-sided, center-hung videoboard and ribbon boards that encircle the arena bowl and the \$23 million Cox-McFerrin Center for Aggie Basketball.
